Physical Education at Beaufort Primary School inspires our pupils to develop moral, social, spiritual and cultural awareness, both of themselves and of others around them.

Spiritual Development

At Beaufort, children develop a sense of enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves, others and the world around them. They use their imagination and creativity in their learning, then reflect on their outcomes. For example, gymnastics lessons allow students to be creative in sequences and choreography. Children can also express personal, emotional and spiritual concepts through dance.

Moral Development

PE at Beaufort promotes a high code of conduct, etiquette, fair play, sportsmanship and respect for the opposition. Students gain a good understanding of the rules of different sports and the importance of not breaking these rules. This allows students to understand the consequences of their actions which can be applied to many areas of their lives.

Children are taught that the only way you can achieve in sport to a high standard is if you work hard and practise- another lesson which is relevant to their lives away from sports.

Social Development in PE

In PE at Beaufort, children use many different social skills in a wide range of contexts, including working and socialising with pupils from different religious, ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds, cooperating well with others and being able to resolve conflicts effectively.

Some practical lessons provide students with the chance to lead warm-ups, skill practices and referee games to enhance social skills.

Cultural Development in PE

Children at Beaufort are encouraged to participate in sports that will help to develop positive attitudes towards different religious, ethnic and socio-economic groups in the local, national and global communities. Sports are introduced to pupils with their relevance and importance to the world and in historical contexts.
